

On arrival you will be met and transferred to your chosen hotel.


Bangalore, often referred to as the 'Garden City' is known for its numerous parks and avenues.



#### Day 3: Mysore

After breakfast, drive to Mysore.

The capital of a former princely state, Mysore is a city of palaces and gardens and is famous for its silk, sandalwood and jasmine.

En-route, visit the Summer Palace of Tipu Sultan in Srirangapatnam and Ranganathittu Bird Sanctuary.

On arrival, check into your chosen hotel and enjoy the evening free to explore the colourful bazaars if you wish.

#### Day 4: Mysore

In the morning enjoy a city tour including Mysore Maharaja's Palace, the Nandi Bull and the Chamundi Hills with the afternoon free.

In the afternoon, visit Belur and Halebid. Belur is known as the southern Varanasi and is a serene spot with the thousand year old temple of Chennakeshava. Halebid has several strikingly beautiful Hoysala temples and Jain shrines.

#### Day 6: Hospet


After breakfast, drive to Hospet, the satellite town built during the reign of Krishnadevaraya.

Hospet is a typical Karnatakan country town with its fascinating Vijayanagar ruins.





#### Day 7: Hampi - Hospet

Enjoy a full day excursion to Hampi to explore the evocative ruins and temples.


Formerly the flourishing capital of the Vijayanagar Empire, Hampi was once abundant in wealth, military power and culture.

The Pampati Swami Temple, the Queen's Bath, the Lotus Mahal, the King's Balance and the musical pillars of the Vittala Temple all evoke memories of bygone splendour.

Other main attractions here are the temple complex of Lord Virupaksha, Ugra Narasimha, Matanga Hill and the Vittala Temple Complex.

Enjoy the afternoon at leisure.

The Badami cave temples are a complex of four Hindu, Jain and possibly Buddhist cave temples located in the north of Karnataka. The caves are considered one of the best examples of Indian rock-cut architecture...

#### Day 8: Badami

After breakfast, drive to Badami, picturesquely situated at the mouth of a ravine between two rocky hills.


Badami is famous for its cave temples - all hewn out of sandstone on the rock face of a hill.


In the afternoon, visit Aihole and Pattadakkal.

Aihole was the ancient capital of Chalukyas, famous as the cradle of Indian Architecture, with over a hundred temples scattered around the village, built between the 6th and 8th centuries.

Situated on the left bank of the Malaprabha river, Pattadakkal is a world heritage site, with 10 major temples representing early Chalukyan architecture

#### Day 9: Goa

After an early breakfast, start the drive to Goa and on arrival check into a beach resort for a 4 night stay.

Goa's coastline provides endless sun-drenched crescents of sand and some of the best beaches in India.

October to February is generally considered the best time of year to visit Karnataka, with lower temperatures and generally settled weather. March to May sees higher temperatures and humidity - prepare for hot and himid in April or May. June to September is the main 'monsoon' season with higher rainfall - some of the highest in fact in all of India.

Karnataka has a population of close to 70 million people, over half of whom are employed in agriculture.

The Kannada language serves as the official language of Karnataka and is spoken by around 65% of the population.

Traditional folk arts cover the entire gamut of music, dance, drama and

storytelling by itinerant troupes.

Yakshagana (below) is a traditional
theatre form combining dance, music,
dialogue, costume, make-up, and stage
techniques with a unique style and form.

The state has three broad geographic areas; the coastal region, the hilly Melanadu region (comprising the Western Ghats) and the Deccan Plateau.




Goa is a well-established beach holiday destination on India's Arabian Sea coast and offers a laid-back destination for relaxation at the end of a tour of India.



## ADD ON MUMBAI



# AJANTA & ELLORA CAVES

1 night from £185 pp For those familiar with E.M Forster's 'A Passage to India', the Ajanta Caves were the real life inspiration for the fictional Malabar Caves, setting for one of the most memorable passages in the novel.

The 30 or so rock-cut Buddhist caves at Ajanta represent the birth of Indian Art, some dating back to the 2nd century BC (others to the 5th & 6th centuries AD).

Ellora is one of the largest rock-cut monastery-temple caves complexes in the world, with Buddhist, Hindu and Jain art dating from the 7th to the 10th centuries. A highlight is the magnificent Kailasha Temple.

This trip is undertaken as an overnight excursion from Mumbai


